There once was a man who walked up to Jesus and said:

"Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" 18 "Why do you call me good?" Jesus answered. "No one is good-- except God alone. 19 You know the commandments: 'Do not murder, do not commit adultery, do not steal, do not give false testimony, do not defraud, honor your father and mother.'" 20 "Teacher," he declared, "all these I have kept since I was a boy." 21 Jesus looked at him and loved him. "One thing you lack," he said. "Go, sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me." Mark 10:17-21 (NIV)



You know the rest of the story. The man goes away sad because he simply couldn't do it. He was wealthy and could not do what Jesus asked him. For me, the basic message of this passage centers on the young man's question to Jesus. "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" The message is there is *nothing* a person can do to inherit eternal life. This amplifies the need of a savior for this man and for all of human kind for that matter. We simply cannot do this tremendously big task of attaining eternal life. You and I need a savior!

But typically this passage is used as a reference to teaching about money. The man in a story has a problem. His problem was his tight grip on his wealth. That was the thing that Jesus recognized that he lacked. Any other person, I believe, could have asked Jesus the same question, and Jesus would have found what that person lacked. All people, you and me included, have things we lack that would keep us from this great inheritance. For some of us, it is the Love of Money.

Money is one of those topics that can cause stress within the church. That probably is the reason why the topic is often neglected. It is a very touchy subject for some people. People can easily be offended by what the church has to say about money.



We are going to talk about money for a few weeks during the message. Money ties in neatly with our current series on Road Trip Religion. So let's do that! Let's talk a little bit about money and how it relates to our Journey of Faith. But freak not! This is not going to be about guilt-ing you into giving. I do hope that what we talk about causes you to think a little bit about the relationship between you, God, your resources, and how you are using those resources. It is about stewardship. What are we doing with all that we have been given? How does this relate to the ministries of our church? How does our overall giving within the church reflect our mission as a church?

I believe the rich man in this passage lack a sense of peace. He was seeking that peace and this was the reason he came to Jesus with his question. That peace comes with a sense of joyful generosity.

I will admit I probably have some unorthodox ideas regarding giving, offering, tithing, and the church. I look forward to sharing some of this with you and getting us to consider the topic of stewardship more deeply within our church.

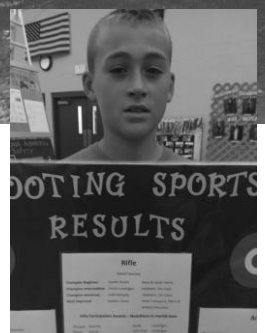

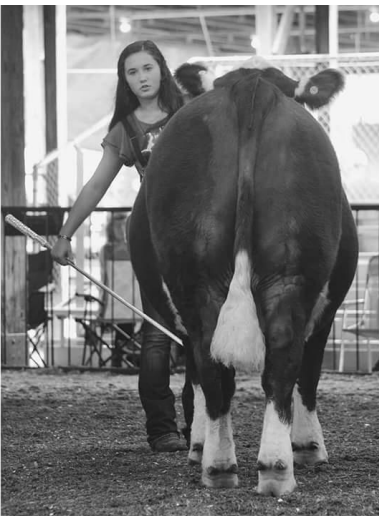
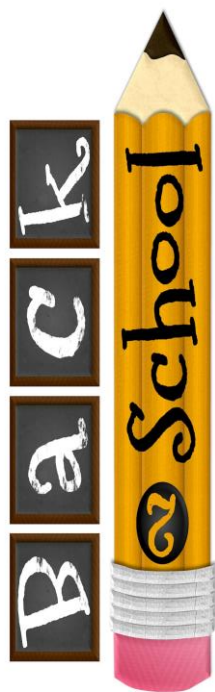
