

Church Growth Spurt

The intention of reprinting much of this is that all Pleasant Chapel stakeholders are informed of what is happening with the church and why.

(REPRINTED FROM SEPTEM-BER Traveler - changes in RED, November additions in BLUE) The Executive Board has been meeting to discuss several things regarding the church and its overall ministries. The church is at a unique time since we went through several weeks where church service could not normally meet and current services are limited in time and attendance due to the restrictions COVID-19 has placed upon us.

But as we looking toward the other side of this, it is a great time to consider a *re-booting* of church. Now is

a great time to consider what the church could be doing differently in order that overall church would be-

> come more effective to those who attend as well as being attractive to the unchurched in our community.

The Executive Board is therefore discussing ideas regarding

- church affiliation with the United Methodist Church
- discipleship opportunities for youth and adults
- facility maintenance and upgrades (a new "life center" or "fellowship hall" addition to the existing building)
- improvements to Sunday morning worship service accommodating the styles of all attenders
- service projects beyond the walls of this church

One of the first areas of work is the decision to remain connected with the United Methodist Church or to explore other options. The committee believes that this one needs some resolution before continuing with the other items. Last fall the church had an exploratory committee to consider disaffiliation. At that time, that committee unanimously decide to pursue this. Then COVID hit. The topic is now up again with the Executive Board and they voted to take the step to have the Northeast District provide the church with the financial obligations Pleasant Chapel would have if the church did disaffiliate.

The committee is NOT deciding to disaffiliate, but rather find out what the church's cost would be to do such. In order for the church to disaffiliate (at a later time) 2/3 of the voting members would have to agree to disaffiliation. If that happens, there will be opportunity for discussion from everyone regarding this important decision.

The Board has received from the District the financial cost to disaffiliate (not including any legal fees which the church may incur)

Therefore, the church will provide opportunities for the entire congregation to hear and discuss the pros and cons of United Methodist denominational affiliation.

Why the church is considering this at this time can be summed up in the form of two questions, each of which all Pleasant Chapel attenders should be praying about:

- 1. Can Pleasant Chapel be more effective as a church remaining in the denomination or disaffiliating from the UMC?
- 2. How important is it for Pleasant Chapel to use this opportunity to acquire and retain the church assets such as the building, the property and finances (currently all assets are held in trust by the Annual Conference)?

Please be prayerful through each of these questions. Talk to other people from the church in order for you to be able to ask questions at the informational meeting as well as make the best informed vote when the Church Conference is held.

The Board is currently scheduling a Church Conference which the District Superintendent will administer for the purpose of a church vote on disaffiliation. There will be 2 informational meetings prior to the Church Conference for anyone to come to hear about disaffiliation, ask questions, and/or voice concerns.

BE WATCHING FOR THESE DATES.

It is important to keep a very high level of transparency about all of these items. The best improvements will occur when all people are informed and have input into what the church does. So as you hear discussions of things that are being proposed, ask questions. Talk to the Executive Board members (names below) so that great communication continues.

The bottom line is that Pleasant Chapel is called to be an inviting, attractive place where people feel welcome to come and be connected with God and with fellow Christ followers. The church should also be a place where people have opportunity to grow spiritually and to serve in the community. Not said to be negative or critical, but Pleasant Chapel can improve to become more effective in what it is we have been called to do.

It is the Board's goal to begin taking steps to do just that – to create a space where Pleasant Chapel can be most effective at worshipping God, making disciples and serving our communities.

The Board has been asked to consider each item and the discussion

prayerfully. They are seeking to discern God's will for Pleasant Chapel. You are asked to pray through this process as well. Pray for this church, pray that God would make known his purpose for the church. Pray that God would be gracious to this church in order for it to be most effective. Pray for the Executive Board as they work through this process.

All church attenders are encouraged to pray for this church decision. All


are encouraged to attend the meetings. However, only voting members will be able to vote on the disaffiliation.

2021 Church Committees Last year in order to streamline the efficiency of the church committees, the five main committees of the church were combined to two. The Trustees and Finance combined to the Administrative Board. The Staff Parish Relations, Nominations, and Church Council combine to the Executive Board. Previously the same people served on more than one committee and since Pleasant Chapel is small, simplifying the organization makes sense. And then COVID hit and committees have not been able to meet. Therefore, the committees will remain with the same members for 2021 as in 2020. The exception would be that if you would like to be removed from a committee you are currently on, or if you would like to serve on one of the committees, this can be arranged. Paranoia strikes deep

It starts when you're always
afraid

You step out of line, the man come and take you away

I think it's time we stop, children, what's that sound
Everybody look what's going down

Be honest, some of you were tapping your foot singing through those familiar lyrics thinking of a more psychedelic, lava lamp, shag carpet, bell bottom, peace sign, mood ring, etc. time period!

But look again at the lyrics that were written in the middle of Vietnam War protests, racial upheaval, protests against authority, and free-spirited immorality. Do we not live in a time where there is violence and "battle lines being drawn?" Today's news shows scenes of "people in the street

Singing songs and carrying signs

Mostly say, hooray for our side."

Think about the signs for TRUMP or BIDEN or BLM or PROLIFE or LBGTQ. Then think about the paranoia that exists as the song says, "when you're always afraid." Consider those who are so locked in fear

and have reduced their lives to total isolation all because of what the Pandemic has done.

It really is kind of déjà vu isn't it? "There's something happening here and what it is" is really pretty clear! What is happening is what has been happening since Genesis 3! When humans decided they could choose to do and live in ways that were better than what their Creator had prescribed for them. That was sin then and it is sin now. It is what is at the root of the problems then, in 1967 when that song was written, and it is the problem we face today in society!

In Romans 1, Paul writes about the consequences humans have as a result of sin:

Romans 1:28-32 (NRSV) ²⁸ And since they did not see fit to acknowledge God, God gave them up to a debased mind and to things that should not be done. ²⁹ They were filled with every kind of wickedness, evil, covetousness, malice. Full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, craftiness, they are gossips, 30 slanderers, Godhaters, insolent, haughty, boastful, inventors of evil, rebellious toward parents, 31 foolish, faithless, heartless, ruthless. ³² They know God's decree that those who practice such things deserve to die-yet they not only do them but even applaud others who practice them.

THANFULLY as followers of Christ, we have been freed from the penalty of being doomed by the effects of sin! AND we are given strength to live life away from the natural tendencies to do wrong and towards an abundant life that is found in Him! AND we are given the grace to see this world for what it really is. It is then we can hear songs like this, hear news stories like we hear, and see the problems facing our world but see them from an eternal perspective. Better is coming!

"What a field day for the" CHURCH! Really! What a great time to be a follower of Christ and part of a local body of believers whose goal is to proclaim Jesus and His good news.

I too think we all need to stop and ask "what's that sound" and see "what's going down." We are in extraordinary times: soon to come through COVID, perhaps soon to have a different political landscape, and soon to make key decisions regarding the future of this church.

I say we all seek God to empower this church to come out of these times **stronger!** Let us come out reenergized to do church better, to be more focused and deliberate about connecting people with their creator. Let us be a place and space where people can grow and serve Him.

This is what those hippies in 1967 needed and it is what the people of our communities today need – a place and the means to encounter the love, mercy, and grace of Jesus Christ.



Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the lands. Serve the LORD with gladness!

Come into his presence with singing. Hyow that the LORD is God! It is he that made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.
