We, therefore, are eager to learn more about God, sharpen our skills and gifts, and allow our character to be developed by him.

So, I hope that this time of year, this Back to School season, inspires ALL of us to remember that we are all students, all learners, all people becoming the people God created us to be.


Roll call was answered by telling "your favorite color". Minutes were read and approved. Treasurer's report was given.

Unfinished Business: Jill & Cynthia are checking on something we could do as a "special outing" in the near future.


Program: Jill presented a lesson on Lydia and other women in the Bible from the Program Book.




Somewhere the Child Kale Douglas Wiggin
