Eclipse! It was the big one, the "one of the century." I must admit it was pretty cool! I hope you had the opportunity to see it. I was working outside during the day and frequently looked up with the glasses to see the moon pass in front of the sun. But you definitely could tell something was going on without the glasses. There was a certain dimness to the day especially when a cloud passed over.

I was reading an article about the eclipse and the author stated that the eclipse is "simple geometry." Observers on the earth are in line with the sun and the moon and the moon, therefore, casts its shadow on the observer. Yes in that sense, it is true and it is a matter of alignment, but is it really that *simple*?

In <u>The Privileged Planet</u>, by Guillermo Gonzalez and Jay W. Richards, the *simplicity* of the alignment is explained a bit. The authors explain the eclipse and shed light on many of the characteristics of the sun and moon and the effects on Earth. One of the things they point out is the size of our moon. Because of its size, Earth's tilt is maintained. And because of that our climate stays fairly regular. Any alteration in this tilt would cause huge temperature shifts, making life much more difficult. The size of the moon also controls ocean tides, which also benefit our weather patterns to promote life.

The *apparent* size of the moon is extraordinary as well. The size of the moon when viewed from the earth is very close to the apparent size of the sun when view from here. That accounts for the view of a perfect fit of the moon over the sun during and eclipse. And even then, depending on the particular eclipse type, the observation for us can be different.

The authors of this book attempt to make the point that these things happen, not as a random act of chance, but rather gifts for us from our Creator. So it really isn't simple. It was intricately designed. They argue that we are in a privileged place in the universe to observe and learn about creation. Of all the other moons in our solar system, none have the same apparent size as the sun. So there is no other place than here to ever observe this type of eclipse. And because of that, scientists have gained so much knowledge about our solar system. God has placed us where we can observe his power.

This week, we were privileged enough to see the declaration of his majesty in an event of the sun. But each day should be a day when we see his work declared by the Son in our lives.

Unfinished Business: Jill & Cynthia gave us some details on


a possible outing we might take.






