

Rolling Stones.

Mary Magdalene, James’ mother (also named Mary) and Salome got up very early on a Sunday morning to do a job. Perhaps it was women’s work to prepare a body for burial and decay. They brought “spices” with them to coat the body and the burial garments so as the process of decomposition took place, the smell could be minimized.

What a dreadful job. To be surrounded by death and to deal with the details of this preparation. But even more, these women were friends of Jesus. They were close to him and his ministry. They would have witnessed the earth-shattering teaching, the per-



fect compassion and care, and the lame who walked, the blind that saw, and the dead who lived again.

But now they walk, perhaps dead in spirit and blind to what was really happening. And as if the job they were going to do was going to be difficult enough, they didn't know how they were going to get to the body.

² Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb ³ and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?"

Mark 16:2-3 (NIV)

Jesus' body was sealed in a tomb behind a large stone which covered its entrance. How were they ever to get to Jesus' body?

I try to imagine what would be on the hearts and minds of these three women. It would be overwhelming, I believe. They have a work to do, a work that is so difficult and painful, and they don't even know how they are going to be able to accomplish it with the large obstacle in their way.

On a much less significant scale, I relate with the overwhelming frustration they must have had. I'm trying to do a small building project on my property. I'd like to get to the work of the project but there seems to be so many obstacle: who can do the initial excavation and what will the cost be. Then, I need to get a building permit, but since the building is close to the road, it is not permitted without going

through the process of a variance petition with the county which involves a survey of the property, a letter of petition, 15 letters out to everyone in the neighborhood, a legal posting in the newspaper, then I MIGHT be able to get a permit. I just want to get to work on this building. HOW CAN I GET THESE BIG ROCKS OUT OF THE WAY!

Yes, I know that is a very small problem in my life, but it is like so many other things in life. Important things that require us to do, to work through, and yet there are stones along the way that must be rolled back first in order to get to the work.

Do you every feel that way about the things in your life? Sometimes you would simply like to go to work to accomplish tasks, but there are office politics that keep you from doing your job. Or just to simply do a great job as a parent, but there are rocks in the way called money, time, other responsibilities. Or perhaps you look around at society and see some of the broken things of our culture and would love to be involved in the work of making those better. But there are obstacles in the way, stones that need rolling.

Ohings for certain. First, we all have things to do, work to be done in all various forms. And second, we will all have

obstacles in our path – stones we cannot roll away. Some simply get stuck there, stuck on things they believe cannot be overcome. Frankly, for many, this is a reason to give up and to not pursue the work that they are called to do or to be the person they are to become. It, for them, is easier to claim to be a victim of their circumstance, their shortcomings, or the things before them that are difficult.

Others persist in spite of the obstacle before them. Mary, Mary, and Salome didn't turn around. They kept going. They didn't know how they were going to accomplish what they were to do, but they did know the next step to take to get them to the tomb. And they persisted.

Their task was accomplished by the power of the Resurrection ... literally! You don't embalm the living.

It is in the power of the death and resurrection that we too can take our steps at accomplishing what is ahead of us. Paul sought this power.

Philippians 3:10 (NRSV)

¹⁰ I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death,

As we celebrate Holy Week and Resurrection Sunday, may we be reminded of the power we possess because we too participate in the death and resurrection of Jesus. May we too center our lives on

him and his accomplished work for us.
