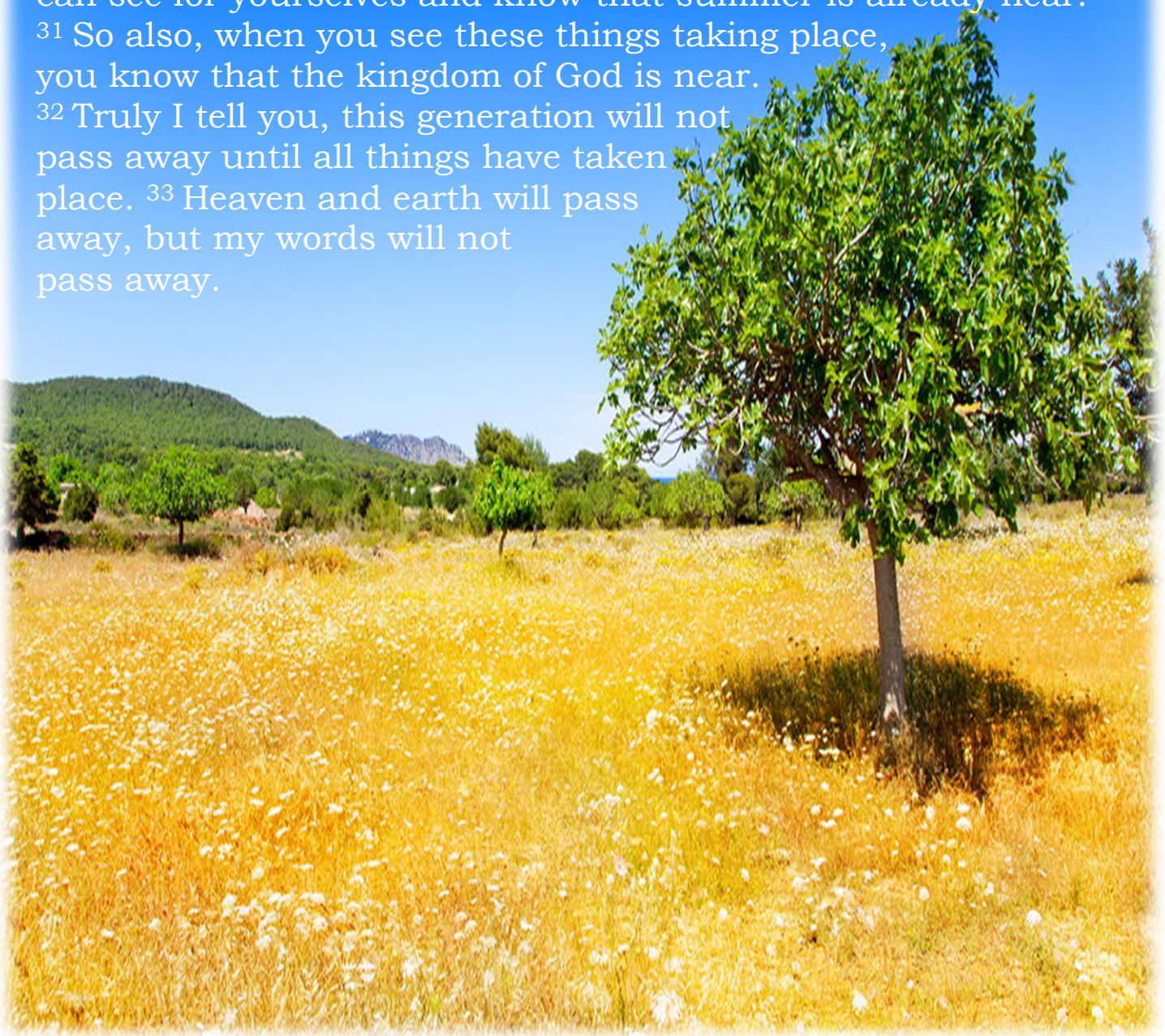

In the meantime, the boards are working on developing the bylaws (constitution) for *Pleasant Chapel Community Church*. The bylaws will include statements for legal identity, our core theological beliefs, and governance.

The intention for the boards is to have this completed by early fall for congregational approval.

A Challenge – Carl Chalk was perusing through the Board of Trustees notes from the early 1900's. It is a very interesting document showing the church history around the time that the current building was being constructed.

The building suffered a massive explosion in 1920 due to a leak in the acetylene light system. Several people were injured and it took several months for the building to be repaired.

When those repairs were completed, a rededication service was held. And the topic for one of the speakers was **"If every member were just like me, what kind of church would my church be?"**

That question seems to be a very old sermon topic and was made into a

contemporary Christian song in the early 1990's.

Carl found the following article that relates that question in a practical way that should challenge us all.

If every member witnessed to others just like me, how many people would be saved?

If every member gave their tithes and offerings just like me, what would be the financial condition of our church?

If every member served just like me, how would our church's ministry be?

If every member's attitude were like mine. . .

If every member's marriage. . .

If every member's love for their child

If every member's home life. . .

If every member's Bible study time.

. . .

If every member's prayer life. . .

If every member's testimony. . .

If every member invited others to church as often as me. . .

The applications of this question are endless. No doubt, it is convicting. But instead of using it to condemn me, I use this question to inspire me. It reminds me that I play a vital role in the life of my family, my community, and my church. It reminds me that every person around me is important, and I can either inspire them or discourage them. My life influences others, good or bad.

It only takes a few to set the pace. Others

will follow your lead. Ask yourself the question, "If every member were just like me, what kind of church would my church be?"

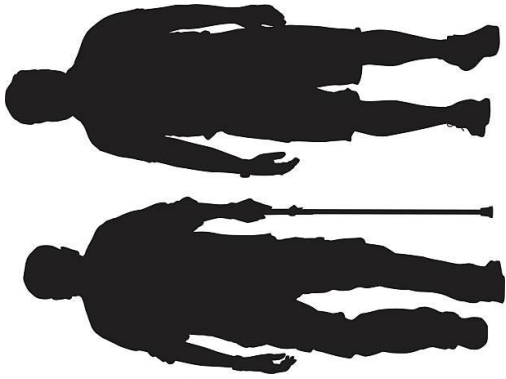
