**Dependence Day** – May 2, 2021 was the church's day to declare (again) their dependence on God and their dependence on the leadership teams of the church.

The church voted on April 28, 2021 to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Denomination. This decision will not be final until June 2021 when acted upon by the UMC's Annual Conference.

If disaffiliation is approved, the church will need to develop its own belief statements, governing procedures, and establish itself as an independent, non-profit (501(c)(3) institution.

The congregation voted to enable and embower the existing Executive Board and Administrative Board to proceed with these initial steps in making *Pleasant Chapel Community Church* (working legal new name) and independent, non-denominational church.

Following the vote, Executive Board Chair Mike Ayers read the following declaration:

### We the People of the Community of Pleasant

Chapel in order to form a more perfect church in the communities of Roanoke Indiana, as we re-establish this local church to glorify God by proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ, declare our total dependence on His grace and that by the Holy Spirit we would become an effective instrument of that grace. We, His people, depend



upon His mercy, patience, and kindness to work within us and through us as we work to develop this local body.

In order for this church to begin to organize and publish the church's beliefs and polity, acknowledge dependence our upon the leadership of this church. Therefore, we declare that we rely upon their leadership to discern God's will for this church and empower them to develop the governing foundations which reflect our understanding of Scripture as they relate to the ministries of this church in this community and in this world.

We commit to pray for the leadership of this church and to appeal to God that he would continue to bless this church. We will support this church and its leadership as they call upon us to be contributing members of this body.

57 people in attendance signed the document indicating their support of the leadership boards of the church, their dependence upon God to grace this church's future, and to commit pray for and support this church during this transition. The document will be available to sign if you were unable to attend service on May 2.

It was an important step for the church. Continue to watch for what God has in store for PCCC!

Pastor's staring at the church windows again!

Have you ever stopped and looked at the four round windows in the front of the church? Each of them depicts a different scene. There is a bird with

a plant in its beak, a man walking and scattering seed, and a sickle and some wheat stalks. The fourth appears to be UFOs flying in and out of some sort of extra-terrestrial star base. Wait! That's can't be! What is that fourth one?

Each of those windows were commissioned for the purpose of conveying a message in our sanctuary. Like the other symbols throughout the church, they are meant to remind or to teach about a Bible story, represent a characteristic of God or of our faith, or to denote a particular truth. Yes they are pretty to look at, rich with color, and have a nostalgic value to them, but they also serve a purpose in our worship.

I tried to find some records indicating the reasons why the

church designers chose the various artwork and symbolism throughout the church, but had no success. I did find the note from the Board of Trustees book that showed where the "emblems" were arranged. If I read that correctly there were "5" emblems but I only see 4. The window in the stairwell (behind the organ speaker) does not have an emblem.

So – say all that to say this: We are going

to talk about these emblems the next several Sundays. They each point to a story or truth that is important to our faith. Now that E.T. one is going to take a little creativity!

It is interesting to read the notes from the Board of Trustees. While searching for info on the emblems, I found the final accounting for the 1910 building and is attached here. The building cost just short of \$14,100! It is kind of fun reading.
