¹/₄ cup mayonnaise
2 teaspoons rice vinegar
2 teaspoons sugar
1 teaspoon sesame oil
2 oranges, peeled, sectioned and cut
in half
1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
3 cups cooked chicken, cut into bitesized pieces
1 cup chopped salted cashews
4 green onions, sliced
2 cups shredded red cabbage
Salt and pepper to taste
4-6 pieces crispy cooked bacon
Dried cranberries

In a large bowl, combine the mayonnaise, rice vinegar, sugar, sesame oil, orange sections and Dijon mustard. Mix until combined. Add the chicken, cashews, green onions and red cabbage. Mixed combine. Refrigerate for at least one hour and season with salt and pepper to taste. To serve sprinkle the cranberries and crumbled bacon on top. Serve 6 to 8.



IV. Thou shall not let Santa take the place of Jesus Christ, lest Christmas become a fairy tale instead of the marking of the greatest life that ever graced this planet.


 Thou shalt not burden thy family, store sales people, nor thy church with a bad attitude.
