Matthew 28:1–10 (NLT) The Resurrection Early on Sunday morning, as the new day was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went out to visit the tomb. ²Suddenly there was a great earthquake! For an angel of the Lord came down from heaven, rolled aside the stone, and sat on it. ³His face shone like lightning, and his clothing was as white as snow. ⁴The guards shook with fear when they saw him, and they fell into a dead faint. ⁵Then the angel spoke to the women. "Don't be afraid!" he said. "I know you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. ⁶He isn't here! He is risen from the dead, just as he said would happen. Come, see where his body was lying. 7 And now, go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and he is going ahead of you to Galilee. You will see him there. Remember what I have told you." ⁸The women ran quickly from the tomb. They were very frightened

but also filled with great joy, and they rushed to give the disciples the angel's message. ⁹ And as they went, Jesus met them and greeted them. And they ran to him, grasped his feet, and worshiped him. ¹⁰ Then Jesus said to them, "Don't be afraid! Go tell my brothers to leave for Galilee, and they will see me there."

Think about Mary Magdalene's reaction to this event! Initially, there would have been a large amount of shock and perhaps disbelief. But Mary's heart would have been stirred with hope. The words of the angel would have ignited a flicker of light in the darkness of her despair, offering a glimmer of optimism. In that moment, Mary's faith would have been put to the test, as she wrestled with the staggering implications of Jesus' resurrection.

Mary's response to the angel's message embodies the essence of faith and devotion. In the face of anguish, she clings to the hope of resurrection, embodying unwavering trust in the promises of God.

Her journey from grief to joy serves as a testament to the transformative power of encountering the risen Christ. This same transformation has allowed millions of believers to find hope in times of despair; the kind of despair that results in the broken relationship with the Father.

This season of Easter we are reminded of the profound impact of encountering the resurrected Christ in our own lives. Like Mary, may we be open to the unexpected ways in which God's promises are fulfilled, allowing our faith to be renewed and our hearts to be filled with the hope of resurrection.
